

About the Event

There is a large and increasing body of scientific evidence demonstrating the psychological and physiological health returning to gardens designed to therapeutic principles, especially for older people. As Hong Kong's population ages, the demand from the private and public sector for therapeutic garden will grow. Developing a greater awareness of the scientific justification, applications of, and demand for therapeutic garden design will enhance the standards and external competitiveness of Hong Kong's landscape architects. This workshop will be the first of a two-part event on this series. This one-day workshop will be led by international experts drawn from private practice and academia to present the 'state-of-the-art' in the field of therapeutic gardens in terms of application, scientific justification and future demand. The second part will be a study tour of therapeutic gardens in Kyoto led by one of the world's leading experts in the field. This will be a rare opportunity for landscape architects and other interested professionals to increase exchanges and co-operation with colleagues in external markets, and Japan in particular.
